MEMBERS - HAVE YOU OPTED-IN ON GrowerWeb?

SSP would like to thank those growers who have already given their consent to Wilmar to share their data with us. Please note that you need to opt in for each and every ABN that you use in your business (a number of growers who have already opted in have done so for only some of their farms).

To reiterate - it is only the productivity data that is being shared - varieties planted, block sizes, farm maps, tons and CCS.

SSP uses the data to:

- Analyze and assess variety CCS trends and compare to the mill.
- Gain access to grower maps used for nutrient planning, monitoring disease outbreaks and general productivity analysis.
- Support for SSP to apply for grant funding on projects.

I had a phone call today from a grower deciding which of the new varieties to plant. Regrettably, I was unable to give them any information regarding CCS as I do not have access to that yet. So in order for us to help you, please make it a priority to opt in via the GrowerWeb.

If you would like some assistance to complete this process, please drop into the CANEGROWERS Proserpine or SSP offices and we'll help you update your preferences. Please be sure to bring your login details with you.

CANEGROWERS PROSEPINE APRIL INSURANCE UPDATE

Are your Building and Contents Sums Insured adequate?

The sum insured noted on your policy is the maximum amount you can claim for any one insured event. It should be enough to remove/ replace your home and belongings if they're damaged or destroyed.

Your home and contents sum insured should reflect what it would cost to rebuild your home or replace your contents at today's prices. This is **NOT** the price you paid for the property or what its current market value is.

Keep in mind! the average price to build a home in QLD has increased by 42% over the last three years (Source :CEO Master Builders Queensland, Paul Bidwell)

To ensure your sum insured is adequate and to avoid underinsurance, regularly review and update the sums insured on your Home and Contents policy and notify your broker if any changes need to be made. A rough guide to help you calculate your building sum insured is approx. \$1800 x the square meters of your home.

LARGE WORKS PROGRAM UNDER WAY AT PROSERPINE MILL

Wilmar Sugar is investing \$25M in capital and maintenance at Proserpine Mill this year, with much of that investment occurring in the lead-up to the 2023 crush.

Major capital projects include a new Pan 3 and condenser, three new vacuum pumps, 50 new cane bins, a major upgrade to the motor control centres (MCCs) for the pan and fugal stations, a new high-grade fugal, and new shredder rotor.

There is a significant maintenance focus on the three boilers, all three mud filters, the milling train, cooling tower and cane bins.


Proserpine Mill has an intensive shutdown period this year, as a result of the late finish to the 2022 crushing season and anticipated early start to the 2023 crushing season.

Wilmar Sugar has brought in additional engineering resources to provide oversight and support as the company delivers an extensive works program in time for the start of crush.

Seasoned shutdown specialists Glenn O'Malley and Frank Forzatti have been seconded to Proserpine Mill to oversee the execution of the maintenance season works program, supporting the local management team.

GREAT PRICES AND GROWER SHED MEETINGS

The Wilmar marketing team has been busy talking to growers about the great prices on offer for the upcoming season and beyond. It is good to see growers continue to average up their forward prices as the market posted new season to date highs over the last month. The 2023 crop traded to a high of \$665 and 2024 to \$585.

The outlook remains tight for the global sugar supply and demand equation. With the northern hemisphere crops cutting out a bit quicker than anticipated, there is even more necessity for the upcoming Brazilian crop to get on the water as soon as possible. Add in a volatile AUD, thanks to the recent financial uncertainty, and there may be the opportunity to see those prices again.

The high prices are also benefiting the tail end of 2022 pricing. For growers who have allocated tonnes to the Production Risk Pool, the forecasted price as at the end of February was just over \$690/t Actual. Similarly, growers who are using the GMPRS pricing mechanism have been able to lock in prices above \$700/t Actual for any tonnes not yet priced.

One of the initiatives this year has been the introduction of grower shed meetings to give growers an update on factors that are affecting the price of sugar, as well as a reminder of other marketing products and services.

In Proserpine, our local marketing consultant Shirley Norris has been organising small groups of growers and presenting the latest Wilmar research on trade flows and market outlooks in an informal and interactive way.

It has also been an opportunity to remind growers that our Pre-Season Payment option remains open until May, for growers who need to boost their cashflow prior to harvest commencing.

From all reports, growers appreciate the sugar market information and enjoy the catch-up with some of their neighbours.

SRA - NEW VARIETIES RELEASED IN CENTRAL REGION



In 2022, the RVC approved the release of **SRA26**^A to Central region growers. It was distributed to growers in Proserpine and Plane Creek in 2022 and will be distributed to Mackay growers in 2023. **SRA26**^A was first released in the Northern region in 2019 and has since been tested in Central region FAT trials. It's performance in these trials is shown in the table below.

SRA26^A is a variety that is resistant to smut, Pachymetra, leaf scald, and red rot, and is intermediate to Fiji leaf gall. It has been evaluated in plant and 1R crops in Central trials where it is slightly below in TCH & higher CCS compared to current commercial cane varieties.

SRA26^A is a reliable germinator with a semi-prostrate early growth habit, often up to and including at fill-in stage. It will straighten up to stand erect providing good harvester presentation. Preliminary experimental results and initial commercial experience in the Northern region suggest **SRA26**^A has RSD sensitivity similar to Q253^A. **SRA26**^A is a very sparse or non-arrowing variety, is moderate trashing with hairy leaf sheaths and does not sucker readily. It is recommended in the North to be harvested mid- to late-season to maximise its CCS.

This year the RVC has released a new variety, **QS07-7049**. Its main features are consistently high tonnes in SRA yield trials, and combined resistance to smut and Pachymetra. It has a large stool with high stalk number, the stalks have average thickness with good length. **QS07-7049** has sparse arrowing, remains upright even in large crops, and doesn't sucker readily even in sprawly crops. Trial data shows that it has significantly higher TCH than the standards used in the trials but has lower CCS when compared to the same standards (see table below). **QS07-7049** has performed well in FAT trials for TCH on a range of soil types.

QS07-7049 has great disease resistance and has shown to be resistant against smut, Pachy, leaf scald, red rot, and intermediate for Fiji leaf gall. **QS07-7049** may be a good choice for growers with blocks with poor soils and high Pachymetra. One concern with **QS07-7049** is that it suffers from brown rust similar to Q253; this moderate level of brown rust was observed in SRA FAT trials and also at the MAPS farm at Victoria plains.

WILMAR LAUNCHES VIRTUAL MILL TOUR

Wilmar Sugar has launched a virtual mill tour that lets anyone, anywhere, step inside a working sugar mill and learn about the sugar-making process. The new VR tour was created at Wilmar's Pioneer Mill in the Burdekin region and is a first for the company.

General Manager Operations Mike McLeod said the virtual tour provided visitors with an immersive experience of the sugar manufacturing process – from start to finish. "We're really proud to launch this virtual tour, as it will allow people from all over the world to explore our Pioneer Mill facility from their computer or mobile device," Mr McLeod said. "It's a fantastic opportunity to showcase our operations, share our knowledge and promote the Australian sugar manufacturing industry."

Wilmar Sugar Production Superintendent James Wallace said the virtual tour would be well received by tourists, students and people from Queensland's milling communities. "We know there's a lot of interest in what goes on inside a sugar mill and we get frequent requests for mill tours, particularly from tourists," he said. "We can't provide public tours due to safety reasons, but now we can offer virtual tours."

Brandon State School Principal Rowan Coffey said the virtual mill tour would be a valuable learning resource. "Our kids are digital kids and they love exploring virtual spaces. This virtual tour will allow children to really look inside the production of sugar and allow us to understand how we produce food," Mr Coffey said. The virtual tour was created using Matterport 3D technology. The final product features 17 'rooms' with information boxes, as well as videos that capture the sights and sounds of the factory.

Visitors can navigate through the different parts of the mill, from the tippler where the cane comes into the factory to the dryer where the sugar crystals are tumble dried before going into storage. They can also see inside the powerhouse, where green energy is generated for Queensland homes. To take the tour, Google 'Wilmar Sugar virtual mill tour'.

The 2023-Season Pricing Declaration Date is 30 April 2023. This is the last day for growers to nominate to their chosen QSL pricing products for the 2023 Season, including the:

- Actively Managed Pool
- Guaranteed Floor Pool
- Self-Managed Harvest Contract
- Target Price Contract
- Individual Futures Contract

Any tonnes that remain unallocated after 30 April will default to the QSL Harvest Pool. Contact Karen to make an appointment to finalise your 2023 pricing options prior to 30 April.
